Live cattle traded at mostly \$136 in the South and from \$142 to \$146 in the North, \$226 to \$230 dressed. This is even to \$2 higher than last week.

This week's Fed Cattle Exchange saw 3,100 head consigned. The Fed Cattle Exchange again helped provide price discovery for the week with sellers dug in asking mostly \$137 – 139 and buyers similarly dug in bidding \$136.75. Listing volume was down for the week as many packers were using forward contracted cattle in the early portion of the month.

Live Cattle futures traded mostly higher for the week, roughly \$1.50 for nearby contracts and \$2.50 or more for deferred contracts.

All eyes are on consumer demand as beef sales and boxed beef prices both moved lower for the week.

Some portions of the Texas Panhandle received rainfall this week. While not enough to end the drought, the moisture and lower temperatures were a relief to many feeders.
